IIn 2020, the world was hit by the COVID-19 pandemic, which made everyone facing challenging and uncertain situations. The pandemic has disrupted access to food, economy, and logistics. Moreover, there is 2.76 million new poverty based on BPS-Statistics Indonesia 2020. This situation has a big impact, especially on children who are part of a vulnerable group which is prone to hunger and they are the generation to fight for our future. Foodbank of Indonesia took steps to prevent hunger, especially in children, by working with various parties and mobilizing thousands of volunteers, mostly women, in several cities. Through campaigns and collaborations, FOI continues the movement by giving hope to those affected because of the pandemic COVID-19.

The struggle against the COVID-19 pandemic required support and action from various parties to overcome food insecurity and hunger problem that arise. One of the campaigns that have been running during 2020 was the 1000 Mothers Action for Indonesia. The action was carried out to prevent hunger, especially for toddlers by inviting Indonesian Mothers to open access to food. Based on the results of FOI's survey in 2020, around 27% of children went to school on an empty stomach. This condition could worsen during the pandemic caused by family poverty and added by school closures.

The role of women in the FOI movement proves that it is very needed in opening access to food, especially for children. The figure of mother and teacher is so important because they are so close on children daily activity and has a direct influence on both education and food-related interventions. Every contribution is also made by jointly embracing the hope of providing the best benefits for the environment.

Foodbank of Indonesia is a social organization dedicated to providing food assistance to Indonesian people who are hungry and vulnerable through strengthening the local community. Our work is focused on three core areas: food intervention, bringing families closer to food sources, and education.

2020 was a surprising year for us because of an unprecedented event in history called the COVID-19 pandemic. Throughout the world, human life was disrupted by the pandemic and the result was very devastating for many aspects of life, especially for those who live in poverty.

The pandemic has forced us to adapt. Governments in many countries took action to contain the spread of the virus and in just a short period of time food distribution was interrupted to many communities due to limited movement. Amidst the COVID-19 pandemic more attention has to be given to vulnerable people, especially children and the elderly. With the decrease of family income as well as new challenges in accessing healthcare and education facilities, children are not only prone to infectious diseases, but also malnutrition which may lead them to be the lost generation.

Responding to the challenging and uncertain situation, Foodbank of Indonesia has tried to adapt by developing strategies which are implemented simultaneously across all 22 cities throughout Indonesia. On behalf of Foodbank of Indonesia, I would like to extend my thanks and gratitude to each volunteer and donor. We are inspired by our volunteers' willingness to keep fighting and finding so many different ways to help those who are vulnerable. Moreover, the support from our generous donors and partners allowed us not only to distribute more food assistance to the needy but also to open a temporary warehouse to support the efforts. We couldn't realise our vision without the support and assistance from our donors and also volunteers - which are mostly women.

FOI believes that women play a decisive role in opening food access to vulnerable people. FOI collaborated with more than 4000 volunteers in 22 regencies/cities and more than three thousand women have worked hand in hand since March right after the pandemic outbreak. From this collaboration, we could distribute 1,246 tones which were distributed through our two big campaigns, namely They Need Us Movement and 1000 Mothers Action for Indonesia.

In addition, we would like to thanks to PT ESRI Indonesia that help us with ArcGIS platform. The system that allow us to track the flow of food donation as well as doing social mapping in the year to come.

We will continue working together to bring relief to those who are struggling with hunger in the years to come. We have commitments to train, educate, and involve women through our program, for us to reach an Indonesia free from hunger or 100% independent.

Together, let us realise the dream where all people have quality food access with dignity.

Year in Review: 2020

Foodbank of Indonesia collaborates with organizations right across the food and grocery sector to provide safe and quality surplus food and redistribute it to the right beneficiary. Besides that, FOI also collaborates with companies to provide funding assistance through a comprehensive granting program. Moreover, there are also individuals donating the excess food. OUR HEROES BUNDA ENDANG STORY

There were extraordinary roles and contributions from various groups or individuals in supporting Foodbank of Indonesia to achieve FOI vision- to open food access for the needy and vulnerable groups in Indonesia. The private sectors, academicians, government, and also volunteers in various regions work together according to their abilities to ensure that Indonesia is free from hunger.

The role of regional volunteers is important for reaching more beneficiaries. We are grateful to have a dedicated volunteer that has a big impact on what FOI does- Bunda (en. mother) Endang from Surabaya. Even though she is no longer young (54 years old), her enthusiasm has never been lost to fight together with FOI. She is a teacher, writer, and activist in various organizations related to local wisdom education and disasters.

"I joined FOI in 2018, introduced by Bunda Kholis (a friend) and at that time I saw the reality in a fishing village where children have to get used to eating instant noodles. Sometimes, it's not easy to convince the community that we (FOI Volunteers) want to help them. There were so many challenges that I and other volunteers have been facing and finally our efforts lead to an understanding that we only want to help them."







"The women's movement is really meaningful, especially Bunda PAUD (preschool teacher). We can reflect her love and concern for the future of Indonesian children through her enthusiasm for the 1000 Mothers Action for Indonesia. They have the same spirit as female volunteers who are never afraid. I think women are strong person."

In the pandemic situation, the demand for food donations is increasing and some disasters occurred in several areas in East Java. Bunda Endang did not feel tired doing her role as volunteer and coordinator in coordinating the food donation for those who were impacted by natural disasters. The reason for her consistent spirit became an inspiration for us. "When I saw the smiles and joy of the beneficiaries, it was like a special spirit for me and suddenly I just forgot my age."

Moreover, she shares her own opinions about the women's movement in FOI activities.

Embracing Hope Amid Crisis

They Need Us Movement

COVID-19 became a pandemic in Indonesia since the first cases were positively diagnosed in March 2020. Since then, the cases have increased gradually. In response, governments have imposed a range of measures to contain the spread of the virus. These include social distancing, restrictions on mobility, and temporary closure of most workplaces, which are known as large-scale social restrictions. These situations have resulted in a growing number of job losses and income reductions. Lower incomes and higher prices of some foods put food out of reach for many. At a time where many were stocking up for quarantine, those who were already on a tight budget were struggling more to make ends meet and became even more vulnerable to hunger. Among those who are struggling, several groups have higher vulnerability consist of people with disabilities, elderly, children, and informal sector workers.

In the early weeks of the pandemic, we have witnessed an increase in people who are in a position to seek food relief. The early weeks demanded flexibility and quick service. Social distancing and restrictions on mobility made changes in how FOI meets the needs of the vulnerable groups while ensuring the health and safety of our staff, volunteers, and beneficiaries. Gerakan Mereka Butuh Kita (en. The They Need Us Movement) was there to support thousands of families who struggle to meet their needs.

DUKUNGAH DANGHE INDOR MTUK PENANGGULAM Through They Need Us Movement, hampers are provided to vulnerable families to make sure they have enough basic food. We also started an outdoor drive-thru model of distribution. These drive-thru models are called Mobil Pangan Umat which operate to distribute ready-to-eat food for informal sector workers and other vulnerable groups. Due to the increasing food relief demand, FOI received support from the government, industry, and institution to open a temporary warehouse. At this warehouse, more than 100,000 food hampers were packed by volunteers for families in need.

From March to June, we were already providing 137.245 packages in six provinces, namely DKI Jakarta, Banten, West Java, Central Java, DI Yogyakarta, and East Java or specifically in 24 regencies/cities in these provinces. Thanks to the funding, business contributions, and community participation, They Need Us Movement was able to support vulnerable families through the early days of the pandemic and through the middle of the year.

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HAMPERS FOR ELDERLY

Collaboration with PT Heinz ABC Indonesia

Older people face the most threats if they contract the COVID-19 due to physiological changes and underlying health conditions. As a thoughtful partner, PT Heinz ABC Indonesia- the Indonesian food division of Kraft Heinz Company- made a IDR 7.5 billion grant to Foodbank of Indonesia that focused on helping 117.000 elderly across 8 locations in Indonesia during Ramadan.

Embracing Hope in the Middle of Crisis

1000 Mothers Action for Indonesia

Amongst those who are struggling, One age group has a worse and longer impact than the other. Children are much more likely to be impacted from the result of COVID-19 as families lose their sources of income which affects families' access to food. Moreover, school and basic health facility closures could impact children's wellbeing. Even before the pandemic, children of Indonesia still suffer from hunger. Based on a survey conducted by the Foodbank of Indonesia (FOI), around 27% of pre-school children went to school on an empty stomach (not having breakfast). This rate could reach 40-50% in several density areas. Despite the challenges caused by COVID-19, FOI continues to distribute the food support driven by our mission to make sure that all children have an equal start in life.

In response, FOI strikes the campaign Aksi 1000 Bunda from June until December. This initiative is a campaign that Invites mothers to participate in overcoming children's hunger by opening food access for the children. Furthermore, this campaign was linked with FOI's programs named Mentari Bangsaku and Sayap dari Ibu.



Through Aksi 1000 Bunda, 3298 women in 25 districts are proactively innovating the way to distribute food to children; 3298 women in 25 cities/districts in Indonesia. During the pandemic, each area distributes the food in different ways suitable with the condition. It varies from direct delivery, pick up service, to dine in with strict protocols. Aksi 1000 Bunda campaign reaches 1045 Early Childhood Education (ECE) institutions with a total of 39,493 children through Mentari Bangsaku program. Moreover, Sayap dari Ibu program continues to distribute the food for toddlers, pregnant women, and breastfeeding mothers one to three times a week. The program is implemented all along 2020 in seven areas with strict health protocols.

APPRECIATION FOR BUNDA

The 1000 Mothers Action for Indonesia campaign is one of the FOI movements in 2020 that engage Indonesian mothers (cadres, PAUD, mother-to-be, experts, and academicians) to move together in opening access to food and fighting hunger in toddlers. The action was held in 17 Regencies/Cities in Indonesia. Through this action, FOI encouraged cooperation and restored the culture of cooperation among the community, private sector, academicians, and government to realize a 100% Indonesia free from hunger.

PT. Frisian Flag Indonesia (FFI) made a major contribution in the form of donating dairy products as a source of highly nutritious animal protein. FFI strongly supported FOI's action as an effort to support the fulfillment of Indonesian toddlers' nutrition requirements. A total of 29,404 children from various regions have been helped through this collaboration. As a way to appreciate the movement of 3.298 "Bunda PAUD" and volunteers in various regions, FOI held the award ceremony called "Anugerah Bunda Teladan 2020" in December 2020. This awarding event- aimed to appreciate those who had participated in FOI's mission to overcome food and nutrition issues in Indonesia- had three categories, Inspiring Mothers (ind. Bunda Menginspirasi), Exemplary Mothers (ind. Bunda Teladan), and Most Active Institutions (ind. Lembaga teraktif). This appreciation event was supported by PT. Frisian Flag Indonesia (FFI) through Susu Bendera. We are thankful to Susu Bendera for continuous support.

OUR HEROES BUNDA TUTI STORY

The 1000 Mothers Action for Indonesia campaign cannot be successful without the role of Bunda PAUD (en. preschool teacher). They have a big role because they are the people who are closest to children through their role in education.

Bunda Sri Utami or often called Bunda Tuti is a preschool teacher in two places, namely PAUD Sandy and PAUD Mawar 01. At her not-so-young age, she is still passionate about teaching and playing a role in the development of Indonesian children. Bunda Tuti has been very concerned about the development of Indonesian children- especially toddlersbecause she has been active in Posyandu (integrated health care) for 11 years and she is active in providing food assistance to children who are victims of disasters. Bunda Tuti has joined the Foodbank of Indonesia since 2015 and realizes that her efforts in educating are not enough, but must be accompanied by helping children through the provision of proper food intake because it affects the child's brain development.

DBS Bank Indonesia

DBS Bank Indonesia started the partnership with Foodbank of Indonesia in 2019. As Purpose-driven Bank, it is our commitment to continually contribute to the society and environment. In 2020, through the "DBS Stronger Together Fund Campaign" we partnered again with FOI, distributed food packages for people affected by COVID-19 in DKI Jakarta Province. Total donations of 380,952 food portions, thousands of vitamins, and masks were distributed to 8,000 families working as informal workers whose income has declined significantly or lost their jobs due to the pandemic. Since we support the act of preserving nature by reducing carbon, we delivered food packages using bicycles to one of the locations in Kampung Starling (roving coffee sellers or coffee on bikes community), Central lakarta.

Fighting Food Waste, Solving Hunger

This year besides the effort to reduce food waste by redistributing it to those in need and people affected by the pandemic, the fight for raising awareness about food waste issues continued. Foodbank of Indonesia was proud to collaborate through the "Towards Zero Food Waste" campaign initiated by DBS Bank. The collaboration entitled "Fighting Food Waste, Solving Hunger" contained several activities to prevent food waste while sharing kindness. There are three activities held. educational activities continued with food drive and volunteer activities. The educational activities were carried out virtually to increase public awareness, especially DBS Bank's employees, about the food waste issue and ways to prevent it. As a concrete way to prevent food waste while helping others, DBS Bank's employees held a food drive which was then distributed by FOI to people affected by the pandemic and people in need. Moreover, those food reliefs were also distributed by DBS employees directly through volunteer activities.

Danone SN Indonesia

With the pandemic affecting daily lives, children who grow up during this period faced the threat of becoming a lost generation. To support parents to fulfill their family, especially children's needs, Foodbank of Indonesia collaborated with Danone Specialized Nutrition (Danone SN) Indonesia. Not only providing food relief for those impacted and meals for the frontlines, but the collaboration has also provided food relief for children based on local ingredients, named AITAMIE and PROBARZ. AITAMIE and PROBARZ was created by the collaboration of Indonesian Danone SN and the Indonesian Institute of Sciences (LIPI) on technology and products. AITAMIE and PROBARZ are food products that are locally produced and fortified, which aim to help increase the nutritional intake of underprivileged children in need and affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

AITAMIE and PROBARZ were distributed to children in Jakarta and Tangerang areas through the Mentari Bangsaku program. AITAMIE was distributed in the form of ready-to-eat food. This ready-to-eat food was then distributed to children who come from underprivileged families through ECE institutions. We are feeling grateful that through this collaboration, we could strengthen teacher's efforts to help children around them to get nutritious food besides education. Our volunteers who were preschool teachers shared that they felt happy because they could help children from underprivileged families more, besides education through reducing tuition fees or for free, by also sharing nutritious food that they have cooked. It was happiness when they could see children's happiness and enthusiasm to learn and grow during this pandemic.

We are so grateful to Indonesia Danone SN and LIPI who have led the creation of local food-based products and so generously donated it as an effort to open access to food as an effort to prevent transmission of COVID-19 through diversification in Indonesia.

Related to food and fighting hunger efforts, starting from the nearest or locally become important. Foodbank of Indonesia (FOI) in collaboration with the Faculty of Agricultural Technology Universitas Gadjah Mada (FTP-UGM), supported by Beelay Bakau Resort, launched #IUAK - Ikan untuk Anak (en. Fish for Children) campaign. This is an action to encourage eating fish as Indonesian local food which is available abundantly and one of the 1000 Mothers Action for Indonesia activities series. Through this activity, the campaign aimed to increase mothers' awareness about the importance of fish as an alternative source of protein to support hunger prevention in toddlers and encourage creative actions to encourage children to consume fish.

This activity was symbolically inaugurated by the Governor of DKI Jakarta also supported by the Mother of ECE of DKI Jakarta Province, Fery Farhati virtually. A total of 20,000 toddlers and 800 mothers in six provinces joined the #IUAK campaign.

Several activities were ranging from launching activities in three provinces, education series to public and mothers, and delicious meals distribution to children activities. Education could be held with the support of the Faculty of Agricultural Technology Universitas Gadjah Mada (FTP-UGM). Moreover, fish-based delicious meals were supported by BeeJay Bakau Resort (BJBR) who donated 1.2 tonnes of fish. We are thankful for our partner's generous support.

Thank You To Our Fundraiser

The pandemic feels easier to overcome when the community gets together to support each other, and fundraising becomes one of many ways.

During the second period of 2020, Berklee Indonesian Community, PERMIAS Massachusetts, and Indonesia Artist collaborated with Foodbank of Indonesia to hold a virtual concert called "Konser untuk Indonesia" in July 2020. This virtual concert was part of #BagiAsa movement which aimed to raise funds to support provision of food assistance for people impacted by pandemic, those in need, and healthcare workers. #BagiAsa movement was initiated by the media such as Katadata, Bisnis Indonesia, SWA and KBR, and the law office of Hendra Soenardi. From this collaboration, Foodbank of Indonesia can provide 2,550 basic food packages and 2,000 ready-to-eat meals and distribute them to 14 points in lakarta. Moreover, we can also provide 'iftar' meals and food packages in other areas such as Yogyakarta, Bandung, Solo, and Surabaya.

Another young generation who has strengthened action during the pandemic was one of the K-Pop communities in Indonesia. Foodbank of Indonesia collaborated with CARAT (Fandom of Korean Boyband Seventeen) to raise funds that will provide food packages for Indonesian healthcare workers as an appreciation for the effort in fighting the COVID-19. CARAT has shown extraordinary enthusiasm and from this movement. we could provide 1122 ready-to-eat food packages which were distributed directly to frontline workers in the lakarta area.





Efforts in ending hunger, especially in children, become colorful with youth participation through social action. We would like to thank them for the action in improving our communities by helping younger generations. FOI has a partner of Indonesian young people community that is called NKRI Youth that addresses the young generation issue in Indonesia. At the end of 2020, NKRI Youth in collaboration with Foodbank of Indonesia held a fundraising activity to help fight hunger in Indonesian children. This was also a part of 1000 Mothers Action for Indonesia campaign.

Besides NKRI Youth, another young generation who has a big concern for the younger generation is Student Executive Board Public Health Faculty of Diponegoro University and Student Executive Board Tarumanagara University. Their concern was actualized by holding fundraising activities and collaborating with Foodbank of Indonesia to distribute nutritious meals to toddlers FOI's program.

We gladly collaborate with these organizations who believe in the youth big role to create better conditions in Indonesia and realize that belief by distributing more than 250 food packages for toddlers in Jakarta, Bogor, Depok, Tangerang, Bekasi, and Semarang area.
